Know Before You Go

Rev. Dr. Solomon Jackson, Jr. 4D Interactive Theater

Immersive 4D theater experiences are available for your students, featuring special effects such as 3D visuals, wind, rain, snow, and more. See scmuseum.org for a list of current show options.

- All shows are \$3 per person and have a capacity of 121 seats and 3 wheelchair spaces.
- Shows are 10 15 minutes long but need a 30-minute block of time for theater entry and exit.
- School groups have access to special showtimes between 9:30 a.m.- 12 p.m.

Lunches

The museum offers a FREE lunch space where visiting school groups can eat. Schools may order boxed lunches from the Crescent Café or bring their own bagged lunches. Due to contract restrictions, outside catering is NOT allowed at the museum.

The Lunch Room must be booked at least 2 weeks before your visit and lunchtimes are in 30-minute intervals.

Museum Store

Every field trip deserves a great souvenir! Pre-order gift bags for your students from the Museum Store and have them ready for pick-up the day of your visit. For more information and to place an order, call 803.898.4967 at least 1 week before your visit.

Accessibility

The museum is proud to be a place everyone can explore! Please let us know if you or your students require accommodations prior to your visit. The museum offers many accessible resources including:

- Accessible bathrooms, sponsored by Aflac, are located on each floor. Family restrooms are available on the 1st and 4th floors.
- Elevators for guests to access all four floors of the museum.
- Wheelchairs available by request.
- A wellness room, sponsored by Aflac, is located on the 1st floor. It features an adultsized medical table, first aid items, menstrual products, adult diapers, and more.
- Sensory bags, communication cards, and noise-canceling headphones are available by request.
- EnChroma color correcting glasses available for guests who are red/green color blind.



 The museum is a member of the HD Sunflower Program, which offers guests a simple way to share they have a hidden disability. Museum staff are trained to recognize the HD Sunflower and provide extra help to any guest wearing it.



Aira Explorer and Aira ASL provide FREE unlimited access to on-demand interpreters via a downloadable app. Aira Explorer gives guests who are blind or have low-vision access to certified visual interpreters. Aira ASL gives guests access to American Sign Language interpreters.

- Please let us know if your school will be bringing an ASL interpreter prior to your visit, and we can assist them with show interpretation.
- Spanish Language programming available for select planetarium shows. Requests may have additional scheduling restraints. Please contact us for details.

The AstroHub

The BlueCross BlueShield of South Carolina Planetarium

The planetarium offers a unique opportunity for your students to learn the science of astronomy, as well as other subjects, including various topics in natural history. This 55-foot dome theater features a digital sky system that provides an immersive experience so your students can see the universe in a whole new way.

Shows are 30-45 minutes in length and require a 1-hour block of time for entry, seating, and exit. School groups have access to exclusive showtimes between 9:30 a.m. – 12:30 p.m. from Tuesday – Friday during the school year.

Earth, Moon & Sun

Discover how the Earth, Moon, and Sun are related and debunk common misconceptions about the universe around us.

The Sky Above: A Live Planetarium Program

A museum educator will take you and your students on a standards-based tour of the sky above us in South Carolina and explain concepts such as constellations, asterisms, moon phases, and celestial navigation.

Astronomy Education Resource

Boeing Observatory

The observatory is home to the historic 1926 Alvan Clark 12 3/8 inch refracting telescope and features an outdoor viewing terrace and adjoining classroom.

Visit the observatory for FREE during your field trip and meet with an astronomy educator who will share standards-aligned astronomy content and engage with your group. Please note: The observatory is an open-air experience and is weather-dependent.

For a flexible option, check out our FREE asynchronous Sky Tours, released bi-weekly on social media. These 5 - 10 minute videos cover various astronomy topics, perfect for sparking classroom discussions throughout the year.

Fossils on Tour

Get hands-on with real fossils and objects from our teaching collection and learn more about the life sciences and natural history of the state we live in.

Grade: 3rd, 4th, 6th, and 8th grade focused. Available for all.

Forming New Bonds

Students will explore the periodic table, have some *pH-un*, and spend some serious *bonding* time with chemical compounds and our popular metallic flame experiment.

Little Lights

Discuss the basic properties of visible light, where it comes from, how it moves, and ways it can be affected.

Learn all about 3 states of matter, their properties, reactions that make them change, and what happens to the atoms in each one.
